PAWED CELEBRATES 10TH ANNIVERSARY AT PAWED AT THE PARK

October 2010 marked the 10th Anniversary of the formation of PAWED! And what better way to celebrate than at our annual fundraiser, PAWED at the Park on October 3rd at the El Dorado Hills Community Park! It was a perfect and fun day for over 1,000 people and their dogs. This was the first year that PAWED had the responsibility for the entire event. All proceeds from the event benefitted the PAWED mobile spay/neuter and disaster response clinic, which was on display and tours provided. After tabulating all revenues and expenses, we are pleased to report that we raised \$7,800!

The day began with the 5K and 3K Walk/Run around the park, with 100 people and their dogs participating. Congratulations to the 5K Run winners: Men's: 1st: Bryan Tully & Lucy; 2nd: Dave Lyle and Mimi. Women's: 1st: Susie Kocsis & Vegas; 2nd: Melinda MacKinnon & Budda. Everyone enjoyed visiting the many Sponsor and Vendor booths, and the dog park, where dogs ran freely in a secure, fenced area, were able to play and socialize...and were closely monitored by staff from the El Dorado Pet Club.

Demonstrations of fun things to do with your dog were provided: Rally Obedience by members of Hangtown Kennel Club, and agility by Tim and Linda Buell and their aussies, Carly, Stitch and Belle. And who could forget the fun costume contests, including Most Creative, Celebrity Look Alike and Dog/Human Look Alike, and the behavior contests including Crazy Pet Tricks and Sit/Stay competition! Towards the end of the day, there was an impressive demonstration by the El Dorado County Sheriff K-9 Teams. The PAWED prize raffle was also a big hit, and that alone raised \$1,700! SWEETSIE'S SECOND CHANCE AT LIFE

Sweetsie, a 10 year old chihuahua mix, never knew what happened to his loving 91 year old mom when he was left at the El Dorado County Animal Shelter recently after his owner passed away. At "middle age", Sweetsie had little chance of getting adopted based on national statistics. Older pets are often euthanized simply because of their age in underfunded and overcrowded shelters all over the country. Many adopters want a puppy or young dog and never think about adopting an older dog who are often trained and have mellowed a bit with age. Tragically, as much as Sweetsie's owner loved him, she did not plan for what would happen to her dog if she passed away, leaving the job of placing the pet to family or friends.



Luckily for Sweetsie, the owner's family brought him to the El Dorado County Animal Services (EDCAS) shelter, and they had room for him. Although it took awhile, he recently found new home thanks to PAWED, who rallied to his aid. Sweetsie was adopted by a friend of PAWED Board member Kerry McBride. Sweetsie's new owner had previously adopted an older dog through EDCAS several years before--a chihuahua named Spencer who was confiscated from a horrifying puppy mill near Somerset and who spent many months in foster care with two PAWED members, overcoming the cruel life he had come from. Recently Spencer passed away due to old age and the family was ready to adopt another "older" dog. The fit was perfect and Sweetsie is enjoying life in his new forever home. Sweetsie was one of the lucky ones.

You never know what can happen-- you plan on outliving your pets, but it doesn't always happen that way. Far too often pets are not provided for in wills or trusts by their owners. In fact it is rare that an owner takes on the responsibility of "preparing" for their pets future without them.

So what can you do to make sure your beloved pets do not end up a statistic? Make a plan. Talk to the people who you think would take care of your pet(s) and make sure they want them. Do not assume they will be able to care for (both physically taking custody and financially supporting) your pets. Once you have found family or friends who will take care of your companions, put it in writing (in your will or trust) and provide funds for the care of the animals. PAWED CELEBRATES 10 in 2010!

Our Winter and Spring 2010 Newsletters outlined PAWED achievements from 2000-2005. This is the last article in this series celebrating PAWED activities 2006-2009.

2006:

- ✔ Completed exterior graphics, major interior renovation and mechanical repair of our mobile spay/neuter clinic. This was achieved through the dedicated work of many PAWED volunteers, and at half the originally projected cost, due to considerable donations of supplies/equipment from community businesses and individuals.
- ✔ Applied for grants and received \$12,865 in grant funding to purchase medical equipment for the PAWED mobile clinic. Grantors included PetSmart Charities, PETCO Foundation, and Teichert Foundation. Also received generous donations from community residents to purchase new stainless steel cages for the mobile clinic.
- ✔ Held 44 adoption events to find homes for pets from the El Dorado County Animal Services (EDAS) shelter in Placerville. These events were generally held at the county shelter each Saturday morning, or at a community event. A total of 49 dogs, 10 cats, 7 goats and 1 rabbit found new loving permanent homes as a direct result of these efforts.
- ✔ Responded to 266 phone calls for our Community Pet Placement Program. This program assists county residents who need to re-home their pets and also provides consultation to help resolve pet behavior issues.
- ✔ Held an Open House at the PAWED office to celebrate the two year anniversary of opening our office.
- ✔ Sponsored and held our third annual "Furry Friends Fitness Walk" at the El Dorado Hills Community Services District park. It was a fun walk for over 110 participants and their furry friends, and raised \$3,000 for the mobile spay/neuter clinic.
- ✔ Staffed booths at several community events to provide public education about PAWED, pet adoption, local shelters, spay/neuter, and proper pet care, training & resources. These events included: Bark In Community Park, El Dorado Hills; Blue Shield Community Outreach Day, El Dorado Hills; Earth Day, Placerville; Hangtown Kennel Club Dog Show, Placerville; National Pet Adoptathon, Placerville; Noah's Wish Open House, El Dorado Hills.
- ✔ Met with members of the County Board of Supervisors (BOS) to discuss the location of the new county animal shelter and attended and made presentations at BOS meetings. We were pleased that PAWED was influential in the Board's decision to purchase property for the new shelter that is centrally located and accessible to the public.

2007

- ✔ Completed full renovation of our mobile spay/neuter and disaster response clinic, including purchase and installation of all surgery equipment and cages.
- ✔ Race Car and Team Desert Dawgs developed by PAWED member, Jeff Lee to raise funds for PAWED mobile clinic. Team Desert Dawgs will participate in a 700 mile race in August 2008 from Reno to Las Vegas and raise funds through pledges for miles completed and sale of paw print decals for the race car.
- ✔ Held 43 adoption events to find homes for pets from the El Dorado County Animal Services (EDAS) shelter in Placerville. These events were generally held at the county shelter each Saturday morning, or at a community event. A total of 96 dogs and 33 cats, found new loving permanent homes as a direct result of these efforts!
- ✔ Many PAWED members assisted the county shelter during their transition to temporary locations, from March through November, by providing foster care for dogs and cats.
- ✔ Responded to 150 phone calls for our Community Pet Placement Program and 305 phone calls to the PAWED office from community residents regarding a wide variety of pet related questions. This is an 85% increase over calls received in 2006, which reflects that PAWED is becoming more well known in the community as a resource.
- ✔ Sponsored and held our fourth annual "Furry Friends Fitness Walk" at the El Dorado Hills Community Services District park. It was a fun walk for over 100 participants and their furry friends, and raised \$4,500 for the mobile spay/neuter clinic.
- ✔ Staffed booths at several community events to provide public education about PAWED, pet adoption, local shelters, spay/neuter, and proper pet care, training & resources. These events included: Bark In Community Park, El Dorado Hills; Earth Day, Placerville; Hangtown Kennel Club Dog Show, Placerville; National Pet Adoptathon, Placerville, Dog day Afternoon, Placerville; Cameron Park & Foothill TaeKwonDo testing event, Raley's Rallies for PAWED, El Dorado Hills, and Show N Shine, Cameron Park.
- ✔ Met with members of the County Board of Supervisors (BOS) to discuss the design of the new county animal shelter, and attended and made presentations at BOS meetings.

2008

- ✔ PAWED mobile spay/neuter and disaster response clinic began operation and met goal to "Operate in 2008". In July, PAWED responded and provided the mobile clinic to assist animals affected by the Butte county fire disaster. In December, PAWED, Animal Outreach and the El Dorado County Animal Services (EDAS) shelter developed a partnership for the spay/neuter of shelter animals. Beginning January, 2009, PAWED will be taking the mobile clinic to the shelter once a week, and Animal Outreach and EDAS staff will work together to perform the spay/neuter surgeries of shelter pets in our clinic.



- ✔ Race for Homeless Pets and Team Desert Dawgs made history: Team Desert Dawgs had the only Stock VW Bug entered in this Race and completed over 230 miles of the 700 mile race in August 2008 from Reno to Las Vegas. The team raised awareness for the plight of homeless pets and raised \$3,000 through pledges and sale of paw print decals for the race car. These funds were raised for the mobile clinic.
- ✔ Sponsored and held our fifth annual “Furry Friends Walk” at the El Dorado Hills Community Services District park. It was another fun walk for over 150 participants and their furry friends, and raised \$10,000 for the mobile clinic.
- ✔ Held 44 adoption events to find homes for pets from the El Dorado County Animal Services (EDAS) shelter in Placerville. A total of 70 dogs and 73 cats found new permanent homes as a direct result of these adoption events and our efforts to place pets from the community.
- ✔ Developed new PAWED public relations materials, including a more professional brochure, dog and cat care adoption packets, and a DVD about PAWED activities.
- ✔ Staffed booths at the following community events: El Dorado County Chamber of Commerce Business Showcase, Noah’s Wish volunteer training, El Dorado County Animal Services Pet Adoptathon, Dog-A-Thon for Center for Visually Impaired, Our Furry Friends Training Center Dog Spring Fair, Bark Avenue first anniversary, Folsom Lake College 40th Anniversary, Woofstock-Rocklin, SPCA Doggie Dash, Youth Fest, Grace Foundation adoption day, Dog Day at Umpqua Bank, El Dorado Nursery Plant-A-Palooza and fundraiser for PAWED.

2009

- ✔ PAWED mobile spay/neuter and disaster response clinic began operation to spay/neuter shelter animals! In late January, the PAWED mobile clinic started use at the county animal shelter in Placerville to spay/neuter shelter animals from the Placerville and Lake Tahoe county shelters. The delivery of these services has been done through a partnership between PAWED, Animal Outreach and the county. Surgeries were done every Tuesday, and between February 1 and December 31, a total of 884 animals were spayed/neutered (343 dogs, 515 cats and 26 rabbits)! This has been an extremely successful partnership to-date and we estimate that it has saved the county over \$20,000 compared to their cost of surgeries in 2008!
- ✔ Held 45 adoption events to find homes for pets from the El Dorado County Animal Services (EDAS) shelter in Placerville. These events were generally held at the county shelter each Saturday morning or at other locations in the community. A total of 72 dogs and 48 cats found new permanent homes as a direct result of these adoption events.
- ✔ PAWED volunteers provided thousands of hours as foster parents caring for hundreds of county shelter pets in their homes. Foster care provided a lifeline for these animals who were too young to be adopted, or had health or behavior problems and the shelter did not have space or resources to care for them. One very dedicated PAWED volunteer fostered 33 dogs during the year. All these dogs had mild to serious behavior problems which she worked patiently to correct, and all were adopted!
- ✔ Provided PAWED trained volunteers to assist the county shelter with cage cleaning, dog exercising and socialization on holidays when the shelter was closed, and also when the shelter was filled with 68 dogs and cats that were confiscated due to serious neglect by a hoarder.
- ✔ Assisted the El Dorado County Animal shelter in Placerville and the Animal Outreach spay/neuter clinic in Diamond Springs by providing funds to purchase much needed equipment such as fencing for a new dog exercise area, Woods lamp to screen animals for ringworm, new cat cages, and an electronic dog scale.
- ✔ Staffed PAWED booths at the following community events: El Dorado Hills Art and Wine Affair, El Dorado County Animal Services Pet Adoptathon, El Dorado Nursery Plant-a-Palooza, Bark Avenue grand re-opening, and National Night Out.
- ✔ Sponsored and held Woofstock event at the El Dorado Hills Community Services District park. This year for the first time, the PAWED Furry Friends Walk and the El Dorado Hills CSD Bark in Community Park events combined into one Woofstock event. It is estimated that over 1,000 people and their dogs attended this fun day, which raised \$4,000 for our mobile clinic.
- ✔ Made administrative improvements of PAWED website at www.pawedpets.org, voice mail and PAWED bookkeeping system. Also began a new PAWED email system.
- ✔ Held Open House in April to celebrate the 5th Anniversary of the opening of the PAWED office.
- ✔ Began CARS program where vehicles can be donated to benefit PAWED.
- ✔ As of December 31, 2009, PAWED had 239 members!
