PAWED Celebrates 10 in 2010!

It does not seem possible that PAWED will celebrate our 10th Anniversary in October this year! WOW—we have come a long way with the help of many dedicated volunteers, PAWED members and donors, grant agencies, and community businesses and individuals who care about the welfare of animals! In each edition of PAWED PRINTS this year, we will feature the history of PAWED's development. We hope you will find this interesting and take pride in the fact that you have been a vital part of this story!

The first three years: 2000-2002

2000:

- ✔ Small group of residents (Charlene Welty, Justine Templeman, Jim Powell, Jennifer Allen) decide to form PAWED—with the Mission to stop the killing of healthy, adoptable animals in El Dorado County. This group was a result of meetings of local residents and county officials regarding possible eligibility to apply for Maddie's Funds—funds to help communities become “no-kill”. Determination was made that no existing organization in county met Maddie's Fund requirements for lead agency. PAWED was formed initially to possibly become a lead agency.
- ✔ August-October: Bylaws written (with help of the Divide Humane Society President, Kris Anderson Moore), Incorporation documents prepared and submitted and Incorporation approved. PAWED applies and is registered, for advance ruling period Oct. 2000-Dec. 2004, as an official nonprofit corporation and charitable organization with IRS, and California Franchise Tax Board, Secretary of State and Attorney General's office.

2001:

- ✔ Developed PR materials: PAWED logo, Mission statement, goals, membership application, shelter fact sheet, t-shirts, brochures, power point presentation.
- ✔ Opened post office box in El Dorado Hills for the receipt of mail and began operating PAWED out of the garage & home of PAWED President.
- ✔ April: began adoption events featuring pets from El Dorado County Animal Control shelter. Events held at Petsmart in Folsom, Clifton & Warren feed store, county shelter, and Pet Expo in Sacramento. Conducted 23 adoption events resulting in 45 dog adoptions.
- ✔ PAWED work parties held to improve shelter facilities: county shelter: painted cat room. El Dorado Humane Society: installed new water heater and sink and completed electrical work.

DOGGIE BAGS, by Bill Smith



If you have had the opportunity to visit the PAWED office lately, you may have seen a recent addition to the frontage, a doggie waste bag dispenser. Due to my professional background in journalism, I received this writing assignment, as it really does fit my news reporting skills. That, and my wife Teri and me installed the thing. But, we are always looking for projects that bring our relationship closer. This was truly one of those projects.

The story goes that there were complaints from other office complex busi- nesses that dog deposits were accumulating around the office faster than the national debt. PAWED discussed the issue with our office neighbor, Mother Lode Pet Emergency Clinic, and both agreed to share the cost to purchase a dog bag dispenser to help solve the problem.

My wife, Teri, tracked down companies that build these devices like she was working on an episode of "America's Most Wanted". She found out that there were many types, designs, and materials for these dispensers-- who knew! Then, PAWED members Jackie Elting and Gay Middleton heard about the pending project, and donated the funds to purchase the dispenser! PAWED and the pet ER clinic split the cost of the bags.

With little experience, I volunteered to erect the contraption. At one time Teri and I had been volunteer wilderness rangers for the U.S. Forest Service, so I used my skills of building forest trail signs. I placed the pooh bag dispenser on a 4X4 post with the letters (PAWED) routed to the front, and painted in yellow. Now this frontage location of the PAWED office has a similar look to a national picnic grounds, but if you choose to use it for that purpose, I would still look around before putting my blanket down!

The people and animal residents of El Dorado County are fortunate, indeed, to have the current staff of El Dorado County Animal Services (EDAS) in Placerville and Lake Tahoe. We will feature EDAS staff in each of our newsletters this year.

Danielle McBride is the most senior of the Kennel Attendants, having worked at the shelter for eight years under the supervision of Kennel supervisor, Tonya Ruffner. Her daily work consists of caring for the many and varied animals that come into and are housed at the shelter, including feeding, cleaning cages, exercising, socializing, evaluating, microchipping and medicating. She also assists the public with adoptions, dog licenses, strays and trapped animals, and owner relinquishment and reclaiming of pets. Another important duty is to help with the PAWED mobile spay/neuter clinic and she keeps it sparkling clean, well stocked and insures that instruments are cleaned, sterilized and wrapped in packs each week. It is a very difficult and demanding job, but she does it professionally and with a smile on her face. Danielle feels the job is very rewarding, especially when she can help find new homes for the large number of animals that have been surrendered to the shelter due to the economy.

Danielle grew up in Placerville, and graduated from El Dorado High School. She had always loved animals, so after high school entered the work force at one of the local veterinarian clinics. Her sister worked for El Dorado County and so Danielle became aware of a position opening at the animal shelter. After the application and interview process, Danielle was selected over many other applicants, partially due to her experience with animals in a veterinary clinic. Danielle is married and has an 11 year old daughter, Caileigh, with whom she spends most of her time when not working. They love camping, sightseeing and shopping together. ZOONOSES – Part Two -- by Lisa S. Couper, DVM

This is a continuation of the Zoonosis article in our Fall, 2009 newsletter...

Your cat can give you cat scratch fever caused by *Bartonella henselae*. If your dog has leptospirosis you could potentially get this bacteria from contact with their urine. You can also get Chlamydia from an infected cat with runny eyes, although it is not the same as the human Chlamydia.



Contact with cat feces during litter box cleaning could result in an infection with toxoplasmosis, but this is primarily an issue for women who are pregnant and possibly people with suppressed immune systems. (Note: these people should also avoid undercooked meat as this is another primary source of infection with this agent.)

You will not get the plague from your pet, but fleas are quite capable of harboring the agent (*Yersinia pestis*) for long periods of time, and you and your pet could contract the plague from their bites when venturing into plague areas in the mountains. And although you could potentially get Lymes disease from your dog, it is not very likely. However, you and your pet can get Lymes disease from ticks. Keep ticks off of your pet and out of your home with a product like fipronil to discourage the freeloaders.

The good news is that most of our pets' diseases are not transmissible to people. Diseases you cannot get from your pet include, distemper and parvo virus from your dog, panleukopenia (feline distemper), feline aids, leukemia, calicivirus and herpes from your cat. Giardia in cats and dogs is thought to be species specific and you are not likely to get this from them, nor will you become infected with coccidia.

There are many other potential zoonotic agents like tularemia, erysipeloid, cryptococcosis, dermatophilosis, sporotrichosis, blastomycosis, histoplasmosis etc. However, as with disease transmission between people, the single most effective way to avoid contracting a zoonotic disease is to *regularly wash your hands after handling your pet or being exposed to pet excrement or saliva*. Proof of the effectiveness of handwashing is that in one study, veterinarians were less likely than the general population to contract a zoonotic disease!

2002:

- ✔ Conducted 32 adoption events at Petsmart in Folsom, Pet Expo in Sacramento and county shelter, resulting in adoptions of 79 dogs, 8 cats and 2 rabbits.
- ✔ Assisted county shelter in writing shelter Volunteer Training manual and conducting Volunteer Orientation trainings.
- ✔ Established pet medical fund to assist in medical costs of county shelter animals.
- ✔ Began free dog training classes for shelter dog adopters.
- ✔ May: PAWED Bylaws revised and filed.
- ✔ 37 members and \$11,665 in bank account.
